## SAILING

### Have you heard of the NCI? (National Coastwatch Institution)

As many of you might know, the Maritime & Coast Guard Agency (MCA) have closed down a number of Coast Guard Stations around the UK, including Thames Coastguard and Solent Coastguard, in order to, in their words, streamline and improve the service offered by the Coastguard Agency. The heart of this new network is the Maritime Operations Centre (MOC) based at Fareham, with a standby MOC at Dover. Eight other Maritime Rescue Coordinating Centres (MRCC's) around the country link to the National network operating around the clock. These are further backed up by a number of Maritime Rescue Sub-Centres (MRSC's)

In order to fill the gaps left by these closures, the NCI was set up as a charity in 1994 after the unfortunate loss of life of two fishermen near to a closed station in Cornwall.

Their Motto is 'Eyes Along the Coast' and our nearest station is on the Cliffs above Folkestone, originally housed in an unheated Martello Tower, but now in a designated lookout (next to Martello Tower No. 3) with Galley, toilet and training room. It is manned by two watch keepers, from a team of 60 volunteers, from 10.00-18.00 (17.00 in the winter) 364 days a year. With 50 stations around our coastline now open, the NCI provide a visual and listening watch to spot accidents, report details to HM Coastguard and to assist as required. They operate on a dedicated Coastwatch Marine VHF Channel, 'Channel 65' and the Folkestone Station's Call Sign is 'Folkestone NCI'. They are available for radio checks, weather reports and general support. Next time you are crossing the channel or sailing to or from the Solent, why not give them a call!


