


RTYC ACADEMY

RCS REPORT - APRIL 2022

I'll start my first article by saying that when elected to the General Committee I certainly didn't expect to find myself writing this article a couple of months later! I have been humbled by the trust placed in me, and support of Flag Officers, (past and present) as I stepped into the RCS role.

There certainly is a lot to get done to ensure we can go racing, certainly too much for one person to manage, and I have received a lot of help and advice which means, fingers crossed, we have what we need in place to go racing. I've summarised the key activities and news below.

Race Calendar

On March 6th I met with the owners where we achieved broad consensus in a number of areas and agreed the race schedule which is now available on the RTYC website, via the racing results and information section. You will see that we have included the proposed dates for cruising events

alongside the race dates to provide a more coordinated calendar. A key outcome of the meeting was the decision to re-instate the popular 'Barrel of Beer' race, which will be combined with the Commodore's Choice Race in August.

Race Hut

I am pleased to report that Fiona Rawbone and the race hut team have agreed to continue volunteering their valuable time and experience for the 2022 season. Many thanks to Fiona, David Parish, Steph Martin, Jean Carron and Julie Rook for their on-going support. Please be sure to give them a wave as you leave the harbour on race day!

I have undertaken the essential maintenance tasks in the hut. We have a bright orange start-line triangle that should be visible from the starting area. The old mast required making safe after some of the rigging was found to missing or badly corroded. The fact I was able to remove the old steel shackles with a pair of domestic wire cutters gives you an idea of their condition! It was considered financially non-viable at this time to reinstate the lines to hoist flags, and a lightweight de-mountable pole has been purchased as an alternative.

Race Marks

The race marks represent the single largest investment in sailing infrastructure that the club has to bear. As we have sought to keep them on station with increasingly substantial anchoring solutions, the costs to the club, for purchase and deployment, have likewise been increasing. Of our eight marks - four are on location, but Northrop Sails, RTYC Navigation are lost with Rally Design onshore in Dover. Kent Decking is onshore in Ramsgate and will be deployed for the whole season, as soon as the opportunity presents itself.

In deference to club finances, and in consultation with the RO and other trusted advisors, I have decided that the three marks that have been lost will only be replaced for the duration of Ramsgate Week, to minimise the risk of further losses.

Looking Ahead

I hope that, like me, you are looking forward to an unencumbered full sailing season for the first time since 2019. I look forward to seeing you out on the water and will sign off by saying a big thank you to Nick Rawbone, Karen Cox, Paul Woodward and Matt Green for their help as I continue to settle into the role.

Nautical Trivia

- 1. Stop Cease
- 2. An "angel" is another term for an anchor kellet or sentinel. This is a weight suspended from the anchor rode to lower the angle between the lower part of the rode and the sea bottom, increasing its holding power while also providing slack to absorb the strain caused by gusts and waves.
- The Japanese term 'honcho-dori' means something like 'main street' and many cities in Japan have one. There certainly were 'honcho-dori' streets of easy virtue in Tokyo and Yokohama that catered for the age-old requirements of sailors in port after a long voyage.
- 4. "I am taking in or discharging or carrying dangerous goods." (Originally used by the Royal Navy specifically for military explosives.)
- 5. 2 hours (half of a normal watch)
- 6. A rogue knot
- 7. The toilet was placed at the fore of the ship aft the bowsprit and to the side so the spray from the bow wave would wash it clean, the correct expression is going to the head i.e. Head of the ship.
- 8. a diagram used to plot deviations of a compass against headings, and to convert compass and magnetic headings.

- 10. 15 Fathoms (90 ft)
